What Is The Cambridge AICE Programme?

The Cambridge Advanced International Certificate of Education (AICE) is an international diploma students earn through an advanced academic curriculum and written assessment program. Tests are administered through a non-profit department (CIE) of the University of Cambridge in England. AICE courses and examinations will be offered primarily during the Junior and Senior years.

The Pre-AICE or International General Certificate of Secondary Education (IGCSE) curriculum and assessment is available for highly motivated, academically oriented high school students.

Cambridge AICE Curriculum

The Cambridge AICE curriculum is comprised of courses that are divided into three subject groups: Mathematics and Sciences, Languages, and Arts and Humanities. AICE candidates must take at least five courses, including one from each of the following groups. Students are encouraged to select a minimum of two additional courses from the listed categories.

Group A: Mathematics and Science

- Biology
- Chemistry
- Environmental Sciences
- Mathematics
- Physics
- Thinking Skills

Group B: Languages

- English
- French
- Latin
- Spanish

Group C: Arts and Humanities

- Art and Design
- Economics
- History — European, International, and U.S.
- Literature — English
- Psychology

How to Earn an AICE Diploma

To be considered for an AICE Diploma, a candidate must earn the equivalent of six credits by passing a combination of exams at the AS Level (1 credit) and A Level (2 credits) over a 13- month period. Students must earn at least one course credit from each of the three curriculum areas.

Students who receive an AICE Diploma earn up to 30 hours of college credit (one full year)!

Colleges and universities award credit on a subject-by-subject basis according to grades earned on individual examinations.
