# What makes this Career Academy different?

The International Trade and Logistics Career and Professional Academy prepares students for careers in international business, supervision and management, marketing, accounting, office management, and all careers that deal with movement and management of goods and personnel.

As part of an Academy program, students may participate in profession-based learning activities such as internships, mentorships, or cooperative learning programs focused on career interest.

They also receive special preparation to give them a jump start on their college education.



Students involved in Career and Professional Academies have the option of graduating with a Gold Medallion or Gold Seal Diploma, subject to meeting the qualifications set by the State of Florida. Meeting these qualifications ensures that students will be awarded either Gold Medallion or Gold Seal scholarships (similar to Bright Futures).

## Required Academic Classes

Students will begin with dedicated classes in Social Studies & Language Arts (ELA I); the following year, students will add ELA II & World History; in succeeding years the academic classes will add ELA III & IV, American Government & Economics; qualifying students will be placed in Honors or Advanced Placement classes.

## Career Opportunities

Career opportunities will be enhanced through skills development and enrichment during class, mentoring from the business community, job shadowing and summer internships for qualifying students. Immediate employment fields include Information Technology, Supervision/Management Trainee, and Bookkeeper Trainee.

## Dual Enrollment and/or Advanced Placement

Students will have the opportunity for Advanced Placement and Dual Enrollment academic classes throughout their high school career; Dual Enrollment classes in career academy courses will be available during their junior and senior years.

## Diploma Opportunities

Gold Seal and Gold Medallion Scholarships are available for any pathway and all qualifying students. Students completing a four-year program receive certification; completed Dual Enrollment credits should transfer to most public colleges or universities.
